International wildlife artist Jackie Garner announces return to “inspiring” Slimbridge WWT with ‘Source to the Sea’ exhibition

Stroud, UK – November 01, 2010 – Jackie Garner, international wildlife artist, announced today that she will be exhibiting at the Cheng-Kim Loke Art Gallery at Slimbridge WWT from 7th November 2010 until 5th January 2011.

From her studio in Stroud, Gloucestershire, Jackie commented “I’m delighted to be returning to Slimbridge WWT after my successful exhibition in 2006. Slimbridge has been a source of inspiration for nearly thirty years. My wildlife art work has taken me from Egypt to the Falkland Islands in recent years, and returning to Slimbridge feels like coming home.”

Jackie is probably best known for her paintings of Falklands’ penguins, although the ‘Source to the Sea’ exhibition will focus primarily on European wildlife. Much of the inspiration for this exhibition will come from wildlife within the beautiful Gloucestershire countryside.

Artist Ian ‘Griff’ Griffiths and sculptor Eddie Hallam will also be exhibiting their work.

Jackie Garner is a professional wildlife artist based in Stroud, Gloucestershire. Her most recent work highlights her increasing fascination with the repeating shapes and colours that link wildlife with habitat.

Jackie’s work is held in collections as far afield as Norway, South Africa, Trinidad and Australia, and has been shown on BBC television.
